

- Something else: 14% of respondents

"These resolutions are not compulsive; only a small share of people who make them actually keep them. ... They are more like a signal for a new start than an actual catalyst for change," the study read.

According to another study in 2018, only 4% of survey respondents stuck to all of their new year's resolutions and only 8% stuck to most of their goals. Thirteen percent of people didn't stick to any of their resolutions.
